

After many years of guiding, I've discovered a ton of great gear that I can recommend! The gear listed below is what I am currently using. It is a balance between lightweight, durable, comfortable and affordable. Keep in mind that this list is for guiding in the Rocky Mountains where temperatures range from 0-80 degrees.

I also recommend the following:

- 1. Acquire a "sales tax exemption certificate" if you are a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Use this certificate every single time that you shop for gear. In some states, you'll save nearly 10% on every purchase.
- 2. Apply for an Amazon Rewards Visa Credit Card and use the 4% reward to purchase more gear through Amazon. 3. Try to obtain pro-deals through Columbia and Osprey. This will allow the guide to purchase personal gear at a reduced price. 4. Guides should put together a more robust kit. Due to the number of hours on the trail, it is wise to invest in a professional setup.
 - In the long run it will save your back, knees and save you money due to long-term durability. Fore example, my boots are three times the cost of the boots I buy for participants, but they last me for 400 miles of hiking.
- 5. It never hurts to search eBay for used gear that's in decent condition.
- 6. I've gotten 1-3 more seasons out of gear that I repaired with duct tape, sleeping pad repair kits and a sewing needle with 15 pound braided fishing line (e.g. If you get a tear in your tent rainfly, duct tape both sides of the tear).
